Are you passionate about your community? Do you want to help make a long-lasting changes? Do you have innovative ideas for the council? Do you have concerns about a specific issue and want to do something about it? then we need you. We need people from all backgrounds and experiences who reflect their community to put themselves forward for co-option to the Parish Council. There are now two vacancies on the Parish Council in the Frankley ward.

No special qualification is required to be a councillor. It is important that all sorts of people serve as Councillors to so that all parts of the community are represented.

What do Parish Councillors do?

New Frankley in Birmingham Parish Council is made up of 12 voluntary councillors. They meet once a month to discuss and act on issues that are important to the local community.

The Parish Council gets a proportion of local taxes to be spent only in the Parish, comments on planning applications in the Parish and run projects that help maintain, improve or enhance the local area. Local Government is changing and parish councils are seeing an increase in the responsibilities and opportunities to influence decisions made that affect our local community.

What is a Parish Council, this is the question asked by residents.

Let us start by defining the words Parish Council.

<u>PARISH</u> A district area within a principle authority, constituted for the purpose of local government.

COUNCIL An assembly of people to advice, discuss, or organize.

An elected body organizing municipal affairs.

Frankley Parish Council have up to twelve councillors who are all volunteers,

There are three part time administrate staff, A Parish Clerk a person designated to assist in various duties of the council, An assistant clerk to assist the principle clerk.

A finance officer to oversea the councils revenues

New Frankley Parish Council is not Birmingham City Council it is described as a minor authority with its own powers.

They are not the same as those of a major authority (i.e. Birmingham City Council)
